The residential program will run from 16th - 20th April, 2013 under the theme "Nurturing young women leaders".It will create a forum through which girls aged 13 to 18 years will be initiated into adulthood and prepared to deal with the challenges that occur during this transition. The project was conceived to give girls access to similar initiation forums that boys already go through initiating them into "manhood".
